Dear Friends of AID Atlanta:

For most of 2020 COVID-19 has moved and changed all of us. Greatest amongst these changes were our inability to gather and greet in person and celebrate holidays. Like everyone, COVID-19 presented AID Atlanta with challenges like never before. Lockdown inspired us to innovate and pivot in ways that we had never imagined.

AID Atlanta developed new ways to facilitate medical care & treatment, medical case management, provide emotional and social support through telehealth, and administer HIV and STI health screenings & treatment. The number of HIV screens remained constant, and STI screens dramatically increased. The number of clients in the health care center increased, and the number of inquiries to the Georgia HIV/STI Infoline increased two-fold. I am proud of AID Atlanta's top-notch professional and dedicated staff who cared for our patients and clients living with and at-risk for HIV/AIDS. AID Atlanta weathered the greatest challenge in years. AID Atlanta is resilient. Thank you for your support.

Together we have had success focusing on coronavirus, and now we want to refocus to get HIV--the virus that causes AIDS--under control by preventing new infections and getting people tested and onto lifesaving, and life-changing medication.

AID Atlanta will continue its efforts of bringing people into care who are HIV+ to improve the viral load suppression rate. Patients will continue to be linked

to medical and social supportive care regardless of their ability to pay. Prevention efforts will focus on utilizing PrEP education and treatment, prevention and behavioral interventions, virtual educational programs including HIV/STD testing and counseling to move closer to ending the HIV epidemic.

AID Atlanta is dedicated to 'Breaking Barriers and Building Community' while remaining focused on our mission. AID Atlanta continues to innovate its service delivery model to continue to provide the best health and social care possible.

ABOUT US

AID Atlanta, Inc. which began as a grassroots organization by a handful of friends who, in response to the national HIV/AIDS epidemic first reported in New York and San Francisco, went into action educating gay men in the Greater Atlanta area about preventing new infections and assisting with medical care. Nearly forty years later, AID Atlanta, Inc. is a nonprofit 501(c) (3) organization in the Deep South that along with its partners provide life-saving medical care, pharmaceutical, and prevention services in Greater Atlanta, Georgia. We educate others and speak frankly about HIV and STIs. Every dollar donated to AID Atlanta stays in Georgia to fund our programs and services

The Mission of AID Atlanta is to reduce new HIV infections and improve the quality of life of its clients and the community by breaking barriers and building community. This mission is accomplished through providing direct client services, health care services, pharmacy, and HIV prevention education. Our mission is further shown through HIV testing and prevention services including outreach to heavily burdened communities in a manner that is meaningful and impactful to them.

PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

AID Atlanta provides direct support to people living with HIV/AIDS in the 31 counties of the Greater Atlanta Area and surrounding rural counties in Georgia by assisting them with accessing resources such as housing and rental support, linkage to medical care and behavioral health, and other essential support services.

AID Atlanta provides primary medical care for individuals living with HIV in two locations. Additionally, through our affiliation with the AIDS Healthcare Foundation, we also have AHF pharmacies co-located in our health care centers. The main location, which is in Midtown Atlanta, Georgia is the primary location frequented by the target population who access HIV prevention services such as HIV testing and linkage to medical care. The second location in the City of Newnan, in Coweta County, Georgia and serves 12 counties in the LaGrange Public Health District 4 including Butts, Carroll, Coweta, Fayette, Heard, Henry, Lamar, Meriwether, Pike, Spalding, Troup, and Upson.

In addition, AID Atlanta offers comprehensive HIV prevention education programs designed to reduce the number of new HIV infections through free and anonymous HIV Counseling Testing and Referral Services, STD Testing and Treatment Clinic, the Georgia AIDS and STD Infoline, and AIDS 101 Action and Awareness Seminars.

PROGRAMS AND SERVICES INCLUDE

DID YOU KNOW?

Open since 2015 AID Atlanta operates one of the city's first PrEP clinics serving 489 clients.

Our clinics in Midtown & Newnan served 339% more clients since 2015.

Services are available to all regardless of the ability to pay - Free HIV & STI testing, and treatment are offered daily.

More than 2,301 calls/emails are received via the GA HIV & STD Infoline every month.

AID Atlanta has a total of 85 employees, 87% of which provide direct HIV services.

Several AID Atlanta case managers provide on-site case management services at various partner organization sites including Clayton, DeKalb, Fulton Boards of Health, Mercy Care, Atlanta Veterans Affairs, the Fulton County Jail, Dekalb County Jail, Jerusalem House, Matthew's Place, Edgewood & Hope House.

AID Atlanta became an official partner and affiliate of The AIDS Healthcare Federation in 2015 helping us to expand our breadth and reach in the community.





AIDS WALK ATLANTA AND MUSIC FESTIVAL 2020

Everyone is hoping for an in person walk for 2021, but if not, another DIY 5K will be a fun time.
